Our Second Floor Bookstore and Spinners downstairs in the Main Library provide the lion's share of the money the Friends use to support the Library.


The Bookstore is open on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month and every Tuesday, and Thursday from 10:30 am to 1:30 pm

Programs

We've been busy, busy, busy this year with several new programs.

Board Game Cafe



The second Saturday of each month we sponsor a Board Game Cafe in the Bedford Room. The Friends have many games available to play from card games and old favorites to newer strategy games. Participants are welcome to play the games provided or to bring their own games.

Seed Library



Our seed library collects and stores seeds and shares them with members of the community for free. Seeds may be from regional seed companies or donated from gardeners. Seed libraries encourage biodiversity and decrease our reliance on major seed companies. This helps combat seed monocultures which threaten the world's food supply.

Similar to a normal library, gardeners "borrow" seeds from the seed library at planting time. At the end of the growing seasons, save the seeds from the plants and return a portion of the seeds to the library.

Seeds are available from February through September.

Caregiver Kits



Caregiver Activity Kits are for individuals who provide care to someone with memory loss. Each item in the kit is specifically selected to spark memories, create conversation and provide positive and engaging interactions between people with Alzheimer's and other dementia-related conditions, and their caregiver.

While the kits are aimed primarily at families who have a person living with them who has memory loss/dementia. They could also be used for persons visiting someone in assisted living, memory care or nursing home. Most activities are designed for interaction with others but some are individual activities.
